



THE MAGICAL WORLD OF NURSERY RHYMES

Communication is one of the most valuable skills in any professional's toolkit. Whether you're just starting your career or you're a seasoned veteran, being an effective communicator at work is key to your success. In order to help participants communicate effectively and with impact in their professional lives by enhancing their verbal and non-verbal communication styles, Ms Manjot Kaur and Ms Balwinder Kaur conducted a session on 3 C's of Effective Communication on 11th November, 2022. This session was attended by our Academic Director Ms. Asheka Tenzin, Principal Ms Shan Liz Sanju, Coordinator Ms. Neha Achhpal, Pre-primary and Primary School teachers.

Through engaging conversations and hands-on exercises, the three parameters—Clear, Concise, and Correct were demonstrated, aiding the audience in understanding and using these rules in their professional communications. The emphasis was on applying these strategies to regular verbal and written contacts, such as leave requests, circulars, formal correspondence with management, etc. A self-evaluation exercise helped the participants reflect and identify their strengths and weaknesses as the session came to a close. All of the educators found the session to be very productive.
